- 4. Read John 14:13-14. Do you think this passage means God will answer every prayer exactly the way we want? If not, why not?
- 5. Have you ever benefitted from God answering a prayer differently than you had hoped or delaying an answer? How?
- 6. What has helped you when God hasn't answered your prayers the way you wanted or when He's delayed an answer?
- 7. Has God ever changed you through prayer? How?
