Consider & Discuss

- 3. What part of the Bible do you find the most challenging to understand? To apply? Why?
- 4. Which Christian speakers and writers have most influenced you? How?
- 5. Read <u>2 Timothy 3:16-17</u>. What is something the Bible has taught, corrected, rebuked, or trained you in recently?
- 6. The theologian NT Wright has written, "Reading and studying scripture has been seen as central to how we are to grow in the love of God; how we come to understand God and his truth more fully; and how we can develop the moral muscle to live in accordance with the gospel of Jesus even when everything seems to be pulling the other way." How do you react to that quote? Do you agree or disagree? How have you seen it to be true (or not) in your life?
- 7. How would you explain the concept of the Bible being God-breathed (inspired by God) to someone who was unfamiliar with it?
- 8. How would you explain the idea of the Bible being our ultimate authority? Do you agree or disagree with that idea? Why?
